

State Senator T'wina Nobles (D)

Sworn into office in 2021, Senator Nobles is the first Black state senator to serve in a decade.

She has served on the University Place School Board, where she has worked to make sure every voice is heard and every child succeeds, by focusing on equity, inclusion, and transparency. She plans to focus this session on housing stabilization, environmental justice, and accessible transportation.

Her committees include Early Learning & K-12 Education (Vice Chair), Higher Education & Workforce Development, Transportation, and Behavioral Health Subcommittee.











State Representative Mari Leavitt (D - position 1)

Representative Leavitt championed critical support services for foster care and homeless students. She's worked to increase safety measures at state hospitals, sales tax exemptions for affordable housing and for organizations addressing homelessness, make college and workforce development training more affordable, and worked with programs focused on behavioral health, aging and long-term care, developmental disabilities affordable housing and homelessness.

She is the Deputy Majority Whip. Her committees include Housing (Vice Chair), Capital Budget, Postsecondary Education & Workforce, and Rules.









State Representative
Dan Bronoske
(D - position 2)

Representative Bronoske priorities include keeping health care accessible and affordable, generating living-wage jobs and robust workplace protections, and developing transportation infrastructure to support our local economy and maintain our quality of life.

He serves as a 21-year firefighter and 22-year EMT in Lakewood, University Place, and Steilacoom.

He is the Deputy Speaker Pro Tem. His committees include Transportation (2nd Vice Chair), Rules, Health Care & Wellness, Labor & Workplace Standards, and Joint Committee on Veterans' & Military Affairs.
