State Senator June Robinson (D)

Senator Robinson has a life-long commitment to public service. After college, she served as a Peace Corps Volunteer in rural Jamaica for three years. Prior to being elected to the Legislature, she held leadership positions in several nonprofit and local government organizations focused on community health, affordable housing and public health.

She is currently employed by Sno-Isle Libraries.

State Representative Julio Cortes (D - position 1)

**Representative Julio Cortes's** family immigrated from Mexico to Washington when he was five years old. She currently serves on the Everett City Council, and is a former Everett Districting Commissioner, Council of Neighborhoods Representative, and legislative staffer in the state House.
