
MEET YOUR LEGISLATORS

State Senator Claudia Kauffman (D)

Senator Kauffman is a member of the Nez Perce tribe and is the only Indigenous woman to serve in the Senate.

She is an advocate for legislation and policy to protect children, address equity, increase support services for people with disabilities, and improve public education in Washington.

She serves as the co-vice chair of the Senate Democrats' Members of Color Caucus.

She is the Leadership Liaison to Tribal Nations. Her committees include Human Services (Vice Chair), Local Government, Land Use & Tribal Affairs, and Transportation.









State Representative Chris Stearns (D - position 1)

Representative Stearns served as the first Native American member of the Auburn City Council. After law school. He began a 30-year legal career. As an attorney, Chris has worked at the state and federal level to advance human and tribal rights, expand clean energy jobs, champion health care access and affordability, and improve economic opportunity for tribal and other marginalized communities. He has also served as chair of the Washington State Gambling Commission and a member of the City of Seattle's Human Rights Commission.

His committees include Regulated Substances & Gaming (Vice Chair), State Government & Tribal Relations (Vice Chair), and Capital Budget.









State Representative Debra Entenman (D - position 2)

Representative Entenman is a daughter of a Seattle teacher who believes in helping people reach their goals by advocating for programs that lift families out of hopelessness and enable them to succeed. She is passionate about education for people of all ages and stages of life.

She has experience with advocacy as an inaugural member of the Seattle/King County Head Start program and served as District Director for Congressman Adam Smith.

Her committees include Postsecondary Education & Workforce (Vice Chair), Civil Rights & Judiciary, Housing, and Transportation.
